

## Bulgaria → Luxembourg

Dog Import Checklist & Quick Guide | TailHarbor | Updated April 2026

### KEY INFORMATION

SIMPLE ROUTE: EU Pet Passport accepted

<b>Preparation Time:</b>	1-2 weeks
<b>Microchip:</b>	ISO 11784/11785 (must be implanted BEFORE rabies vaccination)
<b>Rabies Vaccination:</b>	Required. Minimum 21 days before travel (primary). Keep boosters current.
<b>Titer Test:</b>	Not required (EU-listed/equivalent origin)
<b>Documentation:</b>	EU Pet Passport with current microchip + rabies records
<b>Breed Restrictions:</b>	Dangerous breeds: Staffordshire Bull Terrier, Mastiff, American Staffordshire Terrier, Tosa, Pit Bull, Boerboel, and sim...
<b>Cropping/Docking:</b>	Dogs with cropped ears or docked tails may face import restrictions in Luxembourg
<b>Insurance:</b>	Mandatory liability insurance required for ALL dogs in Luxembourg
<b>Registration:</b>	Local registration required within 2 weeks of arrival
<b>Entry Points (BIP):</b>	Luxembourg International Airport
<b>Dog Tax:</b>	€10-60/year (escalating: first dog ~€30, second ~€60, third ~€100+)
<b>Import Authority:</b>	Administration des Services Vétérinaires

### USEFUL TIPS

- Start the process as early as possible. Delays with lab results or vet appointments can push back your timeline significantly.
- Research airline pet policies early. Some airlines have limited cargo spots, especially in summer. Temperature embargoes apply above 30C / below -5C at any transit airport.
- Start crate training weeks before travel. A calm, crate-confident dog will have a much less stressful journey.
- If your dog is a restricted or mixed breed, get a breed DNA test and official documentation before traveling. Border officials in Luxembourg can refuse entry for banned breeds.
- Non-EU arrivals into Luxembourg must enter through an approved Border Inspection Post (BIP): Luxembourg International Airport.

### PRE-TRAVEL CHECKLIST

#### EARLY PREPARATION

- Confirm your dog's breed is permitted in Luxembourg
- Research airline pet policies and book cargo/cabin spot
- Purchase IATA-approved travel crate (correct size for your dog)
- Begin crate training

#### MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Microchip implanted (ISO 11784/11785) -- BEFORE vaccination
- Rabies vaccination administered (min. 21 days before travel)

#### DOCUMENTATION

- EU Pet Passport up to date with current microchip + rabies records
- All vaccination records compiled
- Copies of all documents made (2 sets)
- Airline booking confirmation printed

#### TRAVEL DAY

- All original documents in carry-on bag
- Crate labeled with your name, phone, destination, and 'Live Animal'
- Water dish filled and attached inside crate
- Arrive at airport early (3+ hours for international with pet)

#### AFTER ARRIVAL IN LUXEMBOURG

- Present documents at Travellers' Point of Entry / Border Control
- Register dog with local municipality within 2 weeks
- Register with local veterinarian
- Obtain mandatory pet liability insurance
