Dog Import Checklist & Quick Guide | TailHarbor | Updated April 2026

KEY INFORMATION

STANDARD ROUTE: No titer test required

Preparation Time:	4-8 weeks
Microchip:	ISO 11784/11785 (must be implanted BEFORE rabies vaccination)
Rabies Vaccination:	Required. Minimum 21 days before travel (primary). Keep boosters current.
Titer Test:	Not required (EU-listed/equivalent origin)
Documentation:	Animal Health Certificate (AHC) issued max 10 days before arrival. Single-use.
Tapeworm Treatment:	REQUIRED for Ireland. Praziquantel, 1-5 days (24-120h) before arrival, by licensed vet.
Breed Restrictions:	XL Bully banned entirely (October 2024). Restricted breeds require muzzle and leash in public: American Pit Bull Terrier...
Cropping/Docking:	Dogs with cropped ears or docked tails may face import restrictions in Ireland
Registration:	approved registration within 21 days of arrival
Import Authority:	Food and the Marine)

USEFUL TIPS

- Start the process as early as possible. Delays with lab results or vet appointments can push back your timeline significantly.
- Research airline pet policies early. Some airlines have limited cargo spots, especially in summer. Temperature embargoes apply above 30C / below -5C at any transit airport.
- Start crate training weeks before travel. A calm, crate-confident dog will have a much less stressful journey.
- The tapeworm treatment for Ireland must be given by a vet 1-5 days (24-120 hours) before arrival. Schedule this appointment well in advance -- too early or too late means refusal.
- If your dog is a restricted or mixed breed, get a breed DNA test and official documentation before traveling. Border officials in Ireland can refuse entry for banned breeds.

PRE-TRAVEL CHECKLIST

EARLY PREPARATION

- Confirm your dog's breed is permitted in Ireland
- Research airline pet policies and book cargo/cabin spot
- Purchase IATA-approved travel crate (correct size for your dog)
- Begin crate training

MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Microchip implanted (ISO 11784/11785) -- BEFORE vaccination
- Rabies vaccination administered (min. 21 days before travel)
- Tapeworm treatment (praziquantel) scheduled 1-5 days (24-120h) before arrival in Ireland

DOCUMENTATION

- Animal Health Certificate obtained (max 10 days before arrival)
- All vaccination records compiled
- Copies of all documents made (2 sets)
- Airline booking confirmation printed

TRAVEL DAY

- All original documents in carry-on bag
- Crate labeled with your name, phone, destination, and 'Live Animal'
- Water dish filled and attached inside crate
- Arrive at airport early (3+ hours for international with pet)

AFTER ARRIVAL IN IRELAND

- Present documents at Travellers' Point of Entry / Border Control
- Register dog in approved within 21 days
- Register with local veterinarian
- Obtain pet liability insurance (recommended)
