### KEY INFORMATION

SIMPLE ROUTE: EU Pet Passport accepted

| <b>Preparation Time:</b>   | 1-2 weeks                                                                                                                    |
| <b>Microchip:</b>          | ISO 11784/11785 (must be implanted BEFORE rabies vaccination)                                                                |
| <b>Rabies Vaccination:</b> | Required. Minimum 21 days before travel (primary). Keep boosters current.                                                    |
| <b>Titer Test:</b>         | Not required (EU-listed/equivalent origin)                                                                                   |
| <b>Documentation:</b>      | EU Pet Passport with current microchip + rabies records                                                                      |
| <b>Breed Restrictions:</b> | 11 breeds classified as aggressive (including American Pit Bull Terrier, Rottweiler, Dogo Argentino, Tosa Inu, American ...) |
| <b>Cropping/Docking:</b>   | Dogs with cropped ears or docked tails may face import restrictions in Poland                                                |
| <b>Registration:</b>       | Local registration required within 2 weeks of arrival                                                                        |
| <b>Dog Tax:</b>            | Import documents may require Polish translation via licensed translator                                                      |
| <b>Import Authority:</b>   | GIW (Chief Veterinary Inspectorate)                                                                                          |

### USEFUL TIPS

- Start the process as early as possible. Delays with lab results or vet appointments can push back your timeline significantly.
- Research airline pet policies early. Some airlines have limited cargo spots, especially in summer. Temperature embargoes apply above 30C / below -5C at any transit airport.
- Start crate training weeks before travel. A calm, crate-confident dog will have a much less stressful journey.
- If your dog is a restricted or mixed breed, get a breed DNA test and official documentation before traveling. Border officials in Poland can refuse entry for banned breeds.
- Make 2 copies of every document (microchip cert, vaccination record, AHC, airline confirmation). Keep originals in your carry-on and copies in checked luggage.

### PRE-TRAVEL CHECKLIST

#### EARLY PREPARATION

- Confirm your dog's breed is permitted in Poland
- Research airline pet policies and book cargo/cabin spot
- Purchase IATA-approved travel crate (correct size for your dog)
- Begin crate training

#### MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Microchip implanted (ISO 11784/11785) -- BEFORE vaccination
- Rabies vaccination administered (min. 21 days before travel)

#### DOCUMENTATION

- EU Pet Passport up to date with current microchip + rabies records
- All vaccination records compiled
- Copies of all documents made (2 sets)
- Airline booking confirmation printed

#### TRAVEL DAY

- All original documents in carry-on bag
- Crate labeled with your name, phone, destination, and 'Live Animal'
- Water dish filled and attached inside crate
- Arrive at airport early (3+ hours for international with pet)

#### AFTER ARRIVAL IN POLAND

- Present documents at Travellers' Point of Entry / Border Control
- Register dog with local municipality within 2 weeks
- Register with local veterinarian
- Obtain pet liability insurance (recommended)
