

## South Korea → Switzerland

Dog Import Checklist & Quick Guide | TailHarbor | Updated April 2026

### KEY INFORMATION

#### EFTA ROUTE: Veterinary certificate + ownership declaration required (not AHC)

<b>Preparation Time:</b>	4-6 months
<b>Microchip:</b>	ISO 11784/11785 (must be implanted BEFORE rabies vaccination)
<b>Rabies Vaccination:</b>	Required. Minimum 21 days before travel (primary). Keep boosters current.
<b>Titer Test (FAVN):</b>	REQUIRED. Blood draw 30+ days after vaccination. 90-day wait from draw date.
<b>Documentation:</b>	Veterinary certificate + ownership declaration (not AHC). Issued by Official Veterinarian.
<b>PROHIBITED:</b>	Dogs with cropped ears or docked tails cannot be imported
<b>Entry:</b>	Basel, Geneva, or Zurich airports only (for third-country arrivals)
<b>Registration:</b>	AMICUS database within 10 days of arrival
<b>Breed Restrictions:</b>	Varies by canton; some cantons ban Pit Bulls and similar breeds (e.g., Zurich, Valais)
<b>Registration:</b>	AMICUS registration within 2 weeks of arrival
<b>Local Currency:</b>	CHF
<b>Dog Tax:</b>	CHF 100-200/year typical

### USEFUL TIPS

- Start the process as early as possible. Delays with lab results or vet appointments can push back your timeline significantly.
- Book your FAVN titer test at an EU-approved lab early. Processing takes 7-14 days, and if results come back below 0.5 IU/ml, you'll need to re-vaccinate and re-test (resetting the 90-day clock).
- Keep your dog's rabies vaccinations current with no gaps. If there's a lapse, the titer test validity may be lost and you'll need to restart the process.
- You need a veterinary certificate AND ownership declaration -- NOT an Animal Health Certificate (AHC). This is different from standard EU documentation.
- Dogs with cropped ears or docked tails CANNOT be imported. This is an absolute prohibition with no exceptions (medical exemption requires 3-week advance FSVO notification for Switzerland).

### PRE-TRAVEL CHECKLIST

#### EARLY PREPARATION

- Confirm your dog's breed is permitted in Switzerland
- Book airline to Basel, Geneva, or Zurich (third-country entry points only)
- Purchase IATA-approved travel crate (correct size for your dog)
- Begin crate training

#### MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Microchip implanted (ISO 11784/11785) -- BEFORE vaccination
- Rabies vaccination administered (min. 21 days before travel)
- Blood draw for FAVN titer test (30+ days after vaccination)
- Titer test result received (minimum 0.5 IU/ml)
- 90-day waiting period completed (from blood draw date)

#### DOCUMENTATION

- Veterinary certificate obtained from Official Veterinarian
- Ownership declaration completed and signed
- All vaccination records compiled
- Titer test certificate included
- Copies of all documents made (2 sets)
- Airline booking confirmation printed

#### TRAVEL DAY

- All original documents in carry-on bag
- Crate labeled with your name, phone, destination, and 'Live Animal'
- Water dish filled and attached inside crate
- Arrive at airport early (3+ hours for international with pet)

#### AFTER ARRIVAL IN SWITZERLAND

- Declare pet at red customs exit
- Register in AMICUS database within 10 days
- Register with local veterinarian
- Check canton-level breed restrictions and insurance requirements
